Responding to the Mental Health Crisis

Griffin's vision to build a first-of-its-kind EmPATH Unit in Connecticut

Griffin Health has embarked on an innovative initiative to address patient care issues caused by the dramatic increase in individuals experiencing serious mental illness leading to an emotional crisis. Your belief in breakthrough, patient-centered healthcare can help make our pioneering EmPATH plans a reality.

The COVID-19 pandemic created an exponential demand for behavioral health services, including support for patients in severe emotional crisis. The National Alliance on Mental Illness reported that 41% of adults in Connecticut experienced symptoms of anxiety or depression, and 121,000 adults have a serious mental illness. With access to behavioral health services in short supply across the state, people experiencing a severe emotional crisis are frequently brought to a hospital emergency department (ED) by community crisis centers and police, and well-meaning loved ones. ED teams are only equipped to evaluate and stabilize patient's requiring psychiatric crisis care and don't include the behavioral health care professionals and support staff required to initiate therapeutic care. Nor is the ED environment conducive to effective treatment. Currently, patients in emotional crisis initially evaluated and stabilized in the ED often must be hospitalized in Griffin's inpatient Psychiatric Unit to begin treatment of their acute psychiatric illness. If an EmPATH Unit were available, hospitalization in many cases could be avoided.

Over the past three years, Griffin Hospital's ED has seen a 50% increase in mental health crisis patients with approximately one in seven ED patients seeking crisis care. This elevation in anxiety, depression and other behavioral health conditions not only exceeds Griffin's and other hospital's EDs



The Empath Unit will have a calming, healing environment. A large, open common space with high ceilings, ambient light and soothing décor will make patients feel more comfortable and less confined. The atmosphere is designed to facilitate stabilization, interpersonal interaction and therapy.

capacity to provide care in a safe environment conducive to stabilization and healing, it also causes delays in patient care overall.

To address this critical need for compassionate and patient-centered crisis care, Griffin Hospital will be the first in the state to offer an Emergency Psychiatric Assessment, Treatment and Healing (EmPATH) Unit. In this calming space, a multidisciplinary team of experts, including psychiatrists, social workers and specially trained nurses work collaboratively to immediately provide personalized care that addresses a spectrum of behavioral health conditions. EmPATH units in the U.S. have been shown to reduce the length of stay for emergency department patients, and the instances of crisis patients returning within 30 days of discharge by 25%. Most importantly, research shows that 75% or more of severe crisis emergencies can be stabilized within 24 hours.
